SEAMEN-WAGES-CLERK OF A STEAMBOAT.

The clerk of a steamboat is a mariner, and entitled to a lien for wages.

Libel for wages. Libellant was hired and served during the autumn of 1856 as clerk of the Sultana, and claimed a lien for his wages.

WILKINS, District Judge. The clerk of a steamboat is a mariner, within the meaning of the law conferring a lien for wages. Curt. Merch. Seam. p. 5, and notes; The Prince George, 3 Hagg.
