PERJURY—SENTENCE.

Upon a conviction of perjury, the court may inflict the punishment of fine, imprisonment, and pillory.

Indictment [against James Snow] for perjury on the trial of Gallowy. Verdict, "Guilty."
Sentenced to pay a fine of \$100, to be imprisoned six months, and to stand one hour in the pillory.
