WALLACE, J. I have carefully examined the brief and authorities submitted by the counsel for Mr. Villard on the petition for a rehearing, but am unable to see how he, as a promoter and abettor of the acts which have worked an equitable wrong to the complainants, can escape responsibility to the same extent with the corporation he represented. 834 The petition for a rehearing has been considered on the merits; that is, as though the cause were here upon a rehearing.
