

All material in the Federal Code should be available, free of charge, to the public in both print and electronic form. The standard of "reasonably available" should mean that no fees shall ever be charged for access to the laws of the United States. This is particularly important for material incorporated by reference, since it is held by private agencies and prohibitively expensive to obtain. Copyright restrictions should never be applied to the laws of the United States. It is a primordial responsibility for the government of a democratic nation to ensure that the public has free access to printed and electronic copies of all the laws that govern it.
