1. Does "reasonably available"

a. Mean that the material should be available:

i. For free and

ii. To anyone online?

Yes. Because it is so easy to copy standards from a word-processing document onto a website, anything not available online is not reasonably available.

b. [Does making materials available online . . .] Create a digital divide by excluding people without Internet access?

No. The public overwhelmingly has access to computers with internet. Those who do not frequent public libraries for computer access. Finally, making materials available online does not preclude making these materials available in other places.
