

"Reasonably available" means that such information should be available for free or for a very small and affordable fee. The most efficient means of distributing such information would be to post it online. It will cost some money to prepare and maintain this information online, but much less than distributing physical copies of lengthy documents.

As for "class of persons affected," laws should be reasonably available to anyone they govern or affect. Which will likely be a great many people. Again, this is an argument for sharing such materials online.

The cost of making these materials available online should absolutely fall to the agency that creates and enforces it.

Any agency without a web presence should have one. It does not cost that much to create and host pages of text that are our laws. No ones budget should be greatly impacted; if it is, one has to wonder how they were getting along on the web at all before.
