## Gentlemen:

As the President and General Manager of INSHORE DIVERS, INC., I encourage acceptance and implementation of changes and revisions to Subchapter V-Marine Occupational Safety & Health Standards, Part 197-General Provisions, Subpart B-Commercial Diving Operations as submitted by the Association of Diving Contractors.

The Association of Diving Contractors comments and recommendations, to be submitted directly by that organization in response to questions # 1 through # 14 of ANPRM, Docket Reference: USCG-1998-3786, have been carefully reviewed by INSHORE DIVERS, INC. It is our opinion that the questions raised by the Coast Guard have been answered in a manner that promotes greater safety in the Commercial Diving industry. We further believe that the adoption and implementation of the ADC recommendations to be appropriate to current USCG initiatives.

It is also strongly recommended that the ADC Consensus Standards for Commercial Diving Operations, to be revised to reflect decisions made with regard to response to reference ANPRM, be, as a minimum, quoted in the resulting rulemaking document as a primary reference for the conduct of commercial diving. In fact, we would urge Coast Guard to adopt the ADC Consensus Standards for Commercial Diving Operations as the U.S. National regulation. In that manner changes can be made in a publicized, timely, and cost effective manner as appropriate to changes in technology. It would also simplify the current regulations enabling USCG units and purchasing authorities to understand the

diving regulations without needing an interpretation for Headquarters, as they now do (West Coast).
