Dear Mr. Malamud:

This is the final response to your enclosed Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Headquarters for records pertaining to Mr. Gregory E. Saunders, Director, Defense Standardization Program Office (DSPO), who also serves on the Board of Directors of the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and previously served as the Chairman of ASTM International. Your request was received in this office on August 20, 2015, from DLA, and assigned FOIA case number 15-F-1662. We ask that you use this number when referring to your request.

This FOIA office only processes requests for the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) and the Joint Staff (JS). There is no central FOIA processing point for records for the entire Department of Defense (DoD). FOIA processing is decentralized and delegated to those officials of the Military Departments and various DoD Components who generate and/or maintain the records being sought or reviewed. The OSD Office of General Counsel (OGC) Standards of Conduct Office (SOCO) does not provide legal advice to DSPO; however, SOCO conducted a search of their records systems based on the information provided in your request. After thorough searches of the electronic records and files of SOCO, no documents of the kind you described could be identified. We believe that these search methods were appropriate and could reasonably be expected to produce the requested records if they existed.

This closes your request in our FOIA Office. If you are not satisfied with this action, you may petition the Appellate Authority, the Director of Administration, Office of the Secretary of Defense, by writing directly to the Freedom of Information Division, ATTN: Appeals Office, 1155 Defense Pentagon, Washington, D.C. 20301-1155. Your appeal should be postmarked within 60 calendar days of the date of this mail, should cite case number 15-F-1662, and should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
