And in the tradition that we have established, the procedure that we go about in order to pick replacement volumes is that we take the data that Lexis has, and we provide the raw data to Paige. We have our legal analyst look at it and make some preliminary decisions on what we think makes most sense from our perspective on what should be replaced as an RV. And the reason that we replace RVs on a regular basis is unless you're going to do a complete recodification on -- you know, every ten years or every so often, you have to do the replacement volumes to keep the code in good condition and not have all of these standalone supplements and things so fraught with pages that it is just not a viable entity for a practitioner to deal with.

So we hand this material over to Paige. We make our recommendations, but we always know that Paige, as the person on the ground in Tennessee, is going to have a better picture of what's going on in the legislature and what's going on with her people in the next year to guide us in what decision should be made. So we go through, we have a discussion, and go

back and forth. So what we originally recommend may not at all be what we end up deciding, but we do it together and come to a conclusion.

So the conclusion we came to this year was that the volumes that should be replaced are Volume 2A, State Government, which would have a 312-page supplement if it was to be published that way.

volume 4, Courts and Procedure, which has not been done since 2009 and really needs to be updated. It would have 292-page supplement. And basically between 300 and 320 pages is where a supplement becomes a standalone supplement.

The next one we decided on is Volume 6. Probate, Mental Health, Guardianship and Fiduciaries and Trust Estates. It is a big volume. It is very awkward. Practitioners don't like that, and we finally decided we had to do something about it because when you look at the fact that the volume is 1,282 pages long and, then, yes, the supplement is not as big as some of the others, but it's 172 pages. So when you put the two together, it's really awkward.

So we decided it was time for a split.

The split will occur after mental health. So probate and mental health will be together, and then guardianship and fiduciaries and trust estates will be

1	together. So that will be two volumes. That will be
2	6, 6A, and then what is currently 6A, Domestic
3	Relations, which does have a standalone supplement will
4	become 6B. So those are the volumes that we recommend
5	this year.
6	Justice Clark, did you have a question?

8	about that. Volume 6A has to become 6B, and Volume 6B,
9	Juveniles, has to become 6C. Otherwise, you're getting
