- I am a licensed attorney and have been licensed to practice law in Tennessee since
- 2. I am a currently employed as an attorney with the Office of Legal Services for the Tennessee General Assembly and have been since 1997. In 2015 I was appointed to serve as the Revisor of Statutes pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 3-12-109. Pursuant to subdivision (c)(3) of that statute, I also serve as Executive Secretary for the Tennessee Code Commission.
- The Commission currently consists of Tennessee Supreme Court Chief Justice Page, Justice Bivens, Attorney General Slatery, Karen J. Garrett, Director of Office of Legal Services, and Susan Short Jones.

- 4. Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 1-1-106, the Commission has the authority to enter into contracts with a law book publisher for the successful production and publication of a revised compilation of the statutory laws of Tennessee. Pursuant to this statutory authority, the Commission has entered in such a contract with Matthews Bender & Co. ("Bender"). Attached as Exhibit 1 is an executed copy of the Restated Agreement for Publication between the Tennessee Code Commission and Matthews Bender & Co.
- 5. Among other things, Bender is required pursuant to Section 2.2 to submit proposed volumes for replacement to the Commission by October 31 every year. Agreement, § 2.2. The Commission reviews and deliberates on proposed TCA replacement volumes during a public meeting held annually, often on the second Tuesday of November. Attached as Exhibit 2 is the Transcript of the November 2020 meeting of the Commission wherein the Commission approved Bender's proposal to replace Volume 2A (State Government), Volume 4 (Courts and Procedure), and splitting Volume 6 (Probate, Mental Health, Guardianship, Fiduciaries, Trusts and Estates) into three separate volumes from its previous two volumes.
